- **M** Scoring System Transparency and Exam Question Weighting: The PMP exam includes 180 questions, but only 175 are scored, while 5 are unscored pre-test questions. Candidates do not know which are scored, requiring consistent effort across all questions. The scoring method is undisclosed, but strategic preparation and mock exams help target "Above Target" performance zones, maximizing success chances.



 
 • New PMP Certification Updates Require Adaptation: PMI updates certification standards periodically, with a new PMP version rolling out in 2025. Professionals holding the older version (valid until 2027 or 2028) can extend certification validity but should prepare to adapt by updating their knowledge and earning PDUs under new frameworks, reflecting PMI's continuous improvement philosophy in alignment with industry trends.
